I have delayed answering because there has been some confusion about the dates for your article, and because you now have a whole month before you! In this way, Article 1 appears in English edition Journal 2, while Article 2 will be published in English and French, Journal 3, at the same time. I hope this change of plan will not upset you. Could I therefore have your text at the latest by May 25? Thank you so much.

I put your query to Peter.
