On October 1st, the Chamber of Commerce hosted a dinner at The Pierre Hotel in honor of the Prime Minister of Portugal, Eng. Maria de Lourdes Pintasilgo, on the occasion of her visit to New York to address the General Assembly of the United Nations.

Other honored guests were the Foreign Minister of Portugal-Dr. João Freitas Cruz, Under Secretary of State Dra. In the Grand Balroom, the dais was presided by Mr. Domenick Scaglione, President of the Chamber. The portuguese wines served were well appreciated by our guests who enjoyed a true spirit of portuguese-american friendship.

Mr. Scaglione was the first speaker, introducing the dais guests and other honored personalities. He briefly outlined the past and future activities of the Chamber of Commerce and its importance in promoting commercial ties between Portugal and the U.S.. And finally, Mr. Scaglione introduced the guest of honor, Eng. Maria de Lourdes Pintasilgo, Prime Minister of Portugal, highlighting her achievements both in private and public life.

In replying, the Prime Minister spoke in very warm terms of the ties that unite both countries, of the difficulties that Portugal has had to face in the not distant past, and went on to mention the opportunities her country can offer both as a commercial and as an investment partner.
