## What is my basic program!

1) There is no political democracy
if there is not a social
economic
cultural democracy

Food/shelter/work/education/medical care
are basic human rights
as much as freedom of expression
and of association
are basic human rights

No country is truly independent if it becomes a satellite of any other power,

so, every country has to diversify the platforms of cooperation

this means also erosion of East/West, North/South



To govern, to run for office is to accept the challenge of leadership and to set the rules guiding the exercise of leadership and the forms of its accountability.

This is what is all about when we speak of women in decisionmaking positions: the concern with real people and their needs the never-ceasing link with diversified reality, leading to different solutions and answers.

So, when we say "equality" we are not meaning access to what men do, and to do it in the same way.

It is only worthwhile to fight for it, in so far as women in decision-making positions of high responsibility question, by theirs attitudes, the paradigm of power.

"The basic premisse of the political discourse seems to be the primitive concept of power as brutal force with the goal of <u>domination</u> and <u>control</u>."

To question this paradigm is to appear as a threat to the establishment.

Because this has to do with:

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- social forces and their freedom to express themselves

- priorities in technological choices

(do they want to dominate nature?)

- respect for human rights.

Therefore, while speaking of and naming the concrete things, women are labelled (as I have been) as an <u>utopian</u> person, as <u>idealist</u>, as <u>populist</u> ...

I. Imagine the Parliament. I have submitted the programme of Government. (I intend to govern not to play political game). I am attacked by the most conservative forces with a mixture of genuine criticism and endless lies ... I had wanted to answer to contents, not to personal attacks. Nevertheless I have to rebuke such perverse behaviour. When I say "I didn't expect lies ... from men whom until then I considered honest", the house almost fells down. They bang on their tables, they shout.

And I asked: Is is the programme? the ideas? the measures?

One of them shouts: Yourself

A dead silence fells in the house. The exorcism has been done. The words have been said.

It was clear that the mere fact of my being a woman was an unbearable fact for them.

The context in which I assumed power made it clear. I was there to change the very nature of political power.

## II. How to avoid marginalization?

First of all, making it true that women are a social movement

- common interests,
- common goals,
- concerted strategies.
- A need for many women to experience the political life and want it entails.

A need for solidarity among women as a basis for women in exercise of political power.

We are still very far from this solidarity. Enquiry of EEC: only 9% of women chose to be represented by another woman (3% of men)

Opportunities of "crisis situations": when all stereotypes are put into question,

when culture is in the making, there is the urgency of the task, new values

new attitudes can be introduced.

III. This solidarity is also connected with the way in which politics is seen.

Politics is an everyday concern and affects all our choices and behaviours.

Once the "traditional" feminine fields of action start moving, the political action in government or other bodies can be changed too.

There is an intricate connection between all fields in society - everything is connected with everything else. If we are playing dirty tricks on the defense front, we are also probably overlooking basic needs in our own societies.

Media and politicians tend to isolate issues.

But if women discover in new terms their understanding of the process of life,

then they can show that all spheres of life are interdependent.

They form a system. You cannot deal with issues at the top-level if at all levels the issues are not coped with in a new and original way.

IV. This is possible if women make the best of one distinctive feature in their lives: <u>the multifunctionality</u>.

Every women performs a thousand activities, unpaid, unaccounted for. She has to change from one to the other.

There was a lot of oppression in that. But at the same time it is an opening to:

conviviality
tolerance
life of multiple expressions
pluralism.

Then, political power may be equated with <u>political</u> <u>leadership</u>,

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a capacity to encompass complexity,
a lucidity to establish priority
to be rigorous and flexible,
an imagination to create strategies.

- f) <u>fundamentalism</u> as running away from complexity.



## VI. If women ran the world

- to overcome intellectual paralysis, to get where the issues are,
- to create thought in frontier-situations
- to give leadership at all levels of the social organization.
