I would put it more in a positive approach, but, of course, you know better than I what is right to to...

As far as my contribution is concerned, I would like to develop it according to the following like very begin conception of the article; I would about the vocation of woman would be the main core of the article; I would say then how this conception is expressed in the current life of the Church, how a continuous dialogue between the doctrine and the experiences-in-life takes place within the Catholic Church; I would add those historical facts or trends which have been most significant in the development of the role of woman in the Church, but I would consciously avoid a mere factual description. — What do you think? Is it in the line you want? I do hope so!

I need to know two things: 1) when shall I have the article ready? 2) how long is it supposed to be? I would like to have the answer to these questions as soon aspossible and I thank you very much for it. In the meantime I am collecting some material and making the first draft of the article. Though, as you probably know, we, in the Grail, are very deeply connected with the ideas and expressions of the vocation of woman, one needs to make a new arrangment for such a definite purpose.
