Prime Minister of Portugal from July 1979 to January 1980, is currently a special adviser to the President of the Republic. She was the first Director of the Portuguese Commission on the Status of Women as well as Minister of Social Affairs (1975) and Ambassador to UNESCO (1976-79).

FAWZIA ASSAAD

a philosopher and novelist, has a PhD in literature from the Sorbonne. In May 1980, she gave a series of lectures on Human Rights in Egypt from the point of view of the status of women. She is the author of a novel, "L'Egyptienne" (1975) and an article, "Mutilations Féminines", which will appear in the Forum Mondial de la Santé.
