(Introductory essay on gender + labor history is a must-read for anyone who writes about or teaches women's history.)

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Women's stories

- Writing the memoir, Judith Barrington, *Eight Names in Stone*, 1988

("Writers are users. We do use the stories around us. I feel that carries a huge responsibility.")

(3 lies that narrative structure often demands:
composite characterization/compression of time/omission
of unnecessary detail.)

[Lying is almost always wrong from an ethical perspective.
But shaping the truth when writing memoir is an acceptable
aspect of the craft. So where are the boundaries here?]

(student: "Some people want to read true things. Some people
don't. Me, I don't give shit. True, false, fiction, non-
fiction, journalism - it all ends up as fiction in the end.")

(one of the things (Judith Barrington) that differentiate memoir
+ fiction is content: if you are telling your readers that this is
a memoir, that this really happened, you are under an
obligation to be guided by the facts, to be guided by the experience,
whereas when you write fiction, you can be guided by what
makes a good story, and those diverge at some point.)

Valerie Miner: "... memoir is a story telling form, but I also feel
there's a kind of commitment to the reader to represent what
we think happened, and what we think has some use for people."

J.B. ... I probably would never like on writing a memoir
that needed a lot of time in the library. But I do have to do
research even so, because there are all kinds of things that
surround the personal story that you have to get right.

(Valerie Miner) - his story belongs to ^{the} people who wrote it,
and what some people are doing is rewriting history
not only in the way they perceive it, but in the way
that they wish that things had occurred.
