QUESTION #1 "WHO AND HOW MANY ARE AFFECTED?"

QUESTION #2 "WHERE ARE THEY LOCATED?"

TENTATIVE PROBLEM STATEMENT: "THE MEDICAL COLLEGE OF OHIO AND ST. VINCENT'S HOSPITAL DON'T HAVE AT THE PRESENT TIME AN ESTABLISHED MECHANISM TO HANDLE ACCEPTABILITY TO WELFARE RECIPIENTS FOR THE MEDICAL SERVICES DELIVERED TO THEM."

As to the question, "Who and how many are affected?", research has shown that those affected are Welfare Recipients from, not only Lucas County, but also several others. Lucas County is unquestionably the main source of Welfare clients to these two hospitals however St. Vincent's and MCOT also treat Welfare recipients from Fulton and Wood counties.(possibly from a few other, but this would be a very small portion of the whole.)

We are told that the only sources for exact data on how many come from each county is only available from the billing depts. at both hospitals. This is classified data and right now is being secured, or some part of it, from MCOT.(Lynn Malley as contact) Right now there is no source at St. Vincent's and it is doubtful that we will get it.

Below you will find a listing from the three main counties involved as to their case load numbers.

*Indicates the recipient no., specifically, the no. preceding it is representative of the case load.

You can see that there are a large enough no. of people on Welfare but this does not answer the question alone, by any means. * As was stated earlier it will be very difficult to obtain the exact no. of recipients who receive treatment at both hospitals/year but we do know from Mr. Zapiecki of the Welfare Dept. that 90% of Welfare Recipients receive medical care at one time or another. This does give us some idea of "How many are affected."

In Lucas County (since this is the main county dealt with) statistics to date showing a breakdown are as follows:

*This is Case Load only, not actual no. of individuals involved. If that were the case the no. would increase tremendously. For example the Aid to dependent children would be in the order of 20,000.

More specifically, MCOT and St. Vincent's have given us a few figures on the no. of cases treated, although not exact no. MCOT states that approx. 33% of their total clinic and ER patients are Welfare Recipients. St. Vincent's has given a figure of 95% for the percentage of welfare recipients treated in the Clinic alone. Keep in mind this does not include the ER room as MCOT's figures did---this is the reason for it being so high. If the ER room was included this figure would go down somewhat. Although St. Vincent's does maintain that it has more Welfare Cases than MCOT---possible something to do with their strategic location!

In acquiring this information much was found in regards to the expenditures of Welfare for their clients and this is available for anyone interested. Unfortunately, it is several pages worth, so it is not Xeroxed for everyone. But just ask if you're interested!!!!!!!

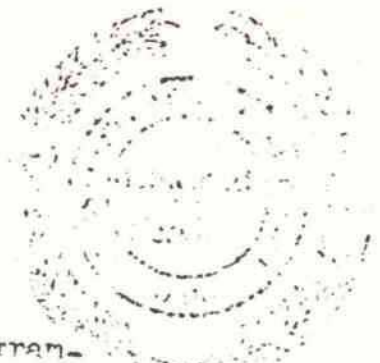

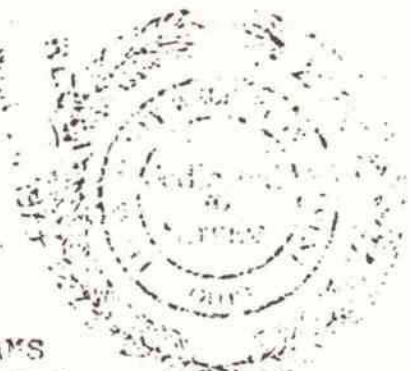

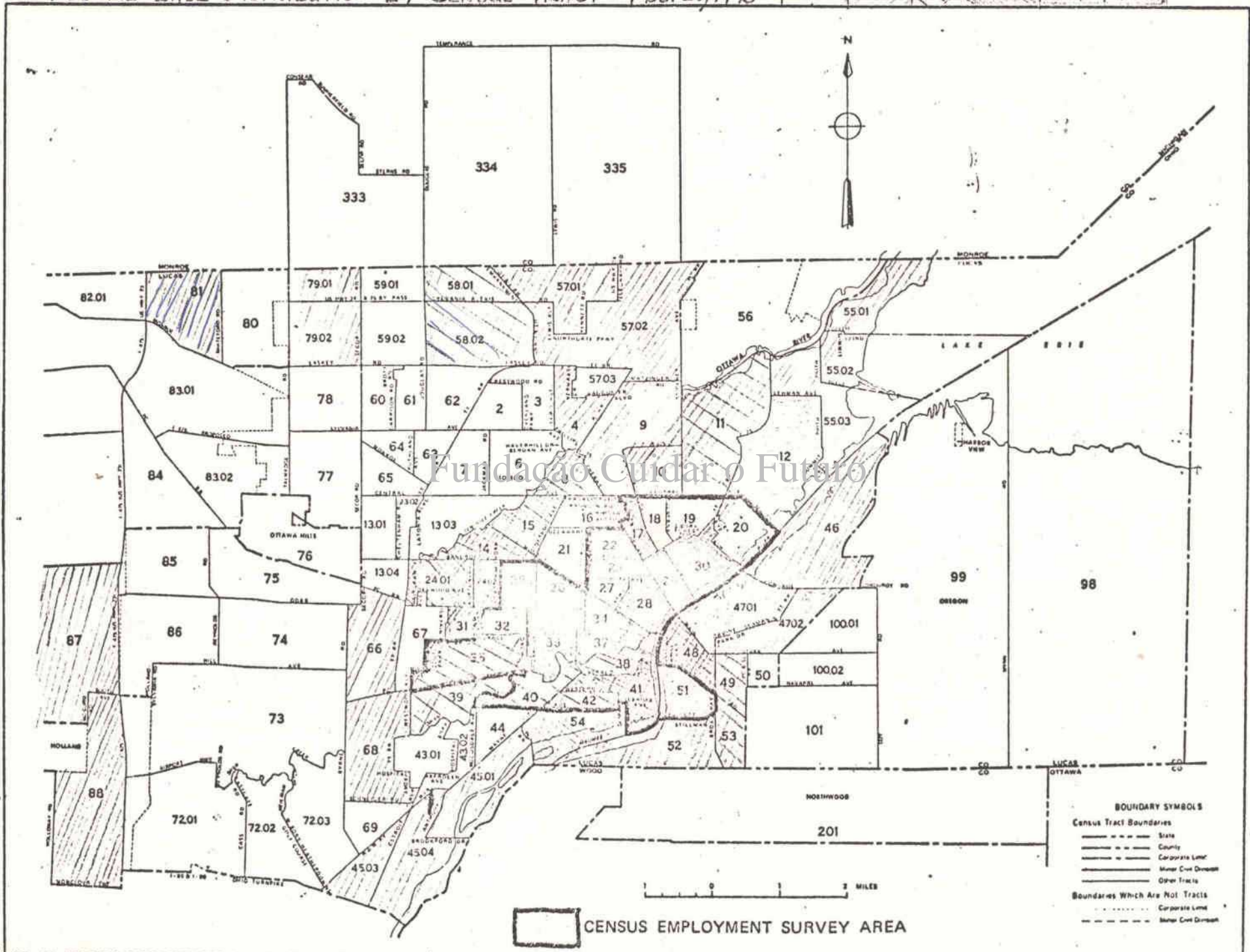
