- 5. Demonstrate your economic power. Don't buy anything on Aug. 26.
- 5. Tell your newspapers to stop sex-segregated help wanted ads.
- 7. Demand to be seated in the "men only" sections in Pogue's, Mabley's and McAlpin's lunchrooms.
- 8. Tell your political parties you want qualified women to run for office.
- 9. Picket the Playboy Club.
- 10. Talk to your daughters and granddaughters about their career goals. Ask them what they want to be and encourage them to aim high.
- 11. Demand quality child care centers. Ohio has \$6 million for child care. Write Rep. Kenneth Creasey, State House, Columbus, Chio.
