

A new international order is in the making. Will it emerge from the use of violence or from a resolute attempt to find common satisfactory solutions through a continuous process of negotiation?

Diplomats, civil servants, union leaders, businessmen and international lawyers all are now confronted with the same challenge of mastering world problems. They are forced to take into consideration issues of trade, financial and monetary policies, energy, raw materials, population, food, health, environment, transfer of technology, transnational corporations and security. Although all deal with issues within their own frames of reference they, nevertheless, meet more and more frequently around the same negotiating tables as part of a planetary bargaining process.

This evolution requires never titralis and rew recluit ques: the capacity to anticipate and to identify long term implications; the ability to grasp the meaning of complex and widening contexts; the sensitivity to perceive and understand the points of view of other parties; and the skill to develop innovative policies or strategies and to present approaches for mutual gain.

The aim of the Centre for Applied Studies in International Negotiations, established in 1979 as an independent foundation, is to assist negotiators, or anyone involved, in the management of various facets of international affairs, to develop new attitudes and new techniques. It seeks to sharpen their analytical and interactive skills, to make them more responsive to practical problems of the negotiating process as well as to broaden their understanding of the global environment in which they operate.

The Centre pursues this aim mainly through the organization of professional programmes, symposiums and informal working sessions, which bring together practitioners from the public and private sectors, and research related activities.

# THE CONDITIONS FOR THE ABSORPTION OF ADVANCED TECHNOLOGIES IN DEVELOPING AND DEVELOPED COUNTRIES

The advance of technology in information processing, telecommunications and process automation, the impact of new materials and biotechnology constitute major factors of change in today's world. While these new technologies offer a wide range of possibilities to be seized by all countries, they give rise to potential problems. Their introduction will affect the entire pattern of socio-economic development as well as the political and cultural stability of all communities. Much will depend on the capacity of each community to satisfactorily absorb and integrate these new technologies. There is therefore, a need for an in-depth analysis.

What are the promises and problems of the introduction of advanced technologies in developing and industralized countries. Is it possible to successfully plan and manage its absorption and what criteria are to be applied in choosing, acquiring, adapting and developing them? Account is to be taken of the role of multinational companies, the effect on existing patterns of interdependence as well as for the search for an international regulatory regime.

These are some of the questions on which this seminar will focus. It will provide participants with an opportunity to assess the practical problems to be faced when introducing advanced technologies. It should allow them to identify solutions to the introduction of advanced technologies in their respective fields of competence and responsibility.



#### THE LEARNING APPROACH



The ten-day annual programme is designed for experienced government officials, business executives, trade-union leaders, lawyers and other professionals from the developed and the developing countries. Past participants have come from ministries of finance, foreign affairs, development cooperation, industry, planning and trade. Trade-unions, such as the Nigerian Labour Congress and Kenya's Central Organization of Trade Unions as well as companies, such as Brown Boveri, Ciba-Geigy, Elf Aquitaine, Fiat, IBM, Indeco, Nestlé, Sandoz have also been represented.

The programme is structured to combine the microand macro-economic, social, cultural and political dimensions of issues and to alkiw an apprecial of the interdependance of these levels of analysis. A spectrum of teaching techniques is employed with an emphasis on approaches which are both participatory and anticipatory in nature: case studies, role playing and negotiation exercises. These are used to foster analytical and interactive skills as well as decision making and negotiating capacities. Other methods-lectures, panels and group discussions -permit a review of conceptual frameworks and theories. The learning process is enhanced by exchanges of experiences and ideas among participants representing a variety of public or private functions and cultural backgrounds.

The seminar's objective is to allow participants to widen their international perspective, to be sensitized to possible changes, to test their assumptions and to identify ranges of possible practical solutions and action-oriented approaches to problem-solving. Participants will be given the opportunity to develop their techniques to formulate better policies and to improve their capacities to implement projects.

#### Fees


The Sw. Fr. 2 900. — registration fee includes tuition, instructional materials and lunches.
