Subject : Collective Consultation of Secretaries of
National Commissions (28 February - 18 March 1977 -
Headquarters - Room IV)

1. In accordance with resolution 7.41 of the 19th session of the General Conference, a Collective Consultation for Secretaries-General will be organized at Headquarters in February-March 1977.
... Please find attached a list of National Commissions invited.
2. Since 1971, there have been repeated requests for a change in the present content and organization of the Collective Consultations. The 94th session of the Executive Board emphasized "the need for further improved methods of consultation and more effective co-operation between National Commissions and the Secretariat" and brought out the idea that a special training element be introduced for new Secretaries-General.
3. Other suggestions have been made as to the organization and content: it was recommended that the number of programme topics covered be reduced. Lectures of a general nature and examination of practical procedures have not been found particularly relevant. Instead, greater emphasis should be laid on the analysis of one or more topical problems within the Unesco field of competence.
4. As in 1976, the Consultation will be divided into three parts instead of the previous two, the first and, more particularly, the second prepared in collaboration with some National Commissions: (i) a general introduction, (ii) a discussion of certain problem-oriented topics, and (iii) individual consultations (see Timetable and annotated Agenda).
5. During the first week, certain of the participants with more experience as Secretaries-General of their respective National Commissions will be asked to prepare, if they so desire in collaboration with the staff of the Secretariat, particular topics to be introduced during the second week of the Consultation. We draw your attention to the fact that for the first time we have foreseen as particular topics the ten objectives of the 19 C/4.

6. The second week is seen as the key to the Consultation; emphasis will be on the leadership and participation of the National Commissions' officials themselves. The responsible Sectors of the Secretariat will be requested to assist in the discussion.

7. The third week remains as free time for the participants to make contacts with members of the Secretariat.

8. The former system of working documents will be discontinued; instead, the 19 C/4 and 19 C/5 documents will be the basic working documents.

9. CPX would appreciate receiving the name(s) of your representative(s) at the discussion of the topic(s) as shown in the attached Timetable and annotated Agenda, not later than 15 February 1977. A meeting of these representatives will be called Tuesday 22 February, at 10 a.m., to discuss more in detail the Secretariat's contribution to the Consultation. We will inform about the room later.
