We have been out of communication for some time, but no doubt from mutual friends you have by now heard about our forthcoming WCRP II.

This letter is a cordial invitation for you to be a delegate-indeed, the only one from Portugal.

Enclosed is the first descriptive brochure of WCRP II, based on the recent meeting of the International Preparatory Committee. I think it may answer most of your questions.

Delegates are asked to arrive at Leuven, outside Brussels, by noon of 27 August and stay until the morning of 4 September. Most delegates will reside in student dormitories or other lodgings. It is expected that the costs of lodging and food for this eight-lay perixly LLL (mount to 4,000 to 6,000 Belgian francs (or the equivalent of \$100 to \$150).

We will then send you the background material for delegates to reach you sometime in June as well as detailed travel and other information.
