I am sure that you understand the reasons behind my silence. Since the 25th April, this country has undertaken a most radical change and time is short to live all the events and to reflect upon them. Though I had spent many hours in the past dwelling on the topic of "revolution", I must acknowledge that to be in the midst of it is a totally different thing which leaves us sometimes without the necessary ideological explanation to face the inconsistency of contradictory forces. There is a lot to be said about the religious awareness re-created by the feeling of value-emptiness of the revolutionary moment. I hope to be abled to say it an a north there way in not too distant a future. Maybe this is what I would bring to a meeting like the WCRP II...

Indeed, Dr.Jack, I am most honoured by your invitation and am looking forward to the forthcoming meeting in Leuven. As far as I can see, I am decided to attend the meeting.

Do I presume well that you will be in Europe from May 10th onwards until the WCRP II? If so, I would be grateful to know if I can meet you sometime in <u>June</u>, as I am intending to go to France sometime during that month.

By then, I might be able to focuse better what I am living now in terms of religion-and-peace in the whirling of the revolutionary events and unleashed forces. Maybe such a reflection will have a place in one of the commissions or of the panels. In fact, the whole question of Southern Africa remains paramount in my concerns. Are you still in touch with the friends of the American Committee on Africa? All possible links with the Liberation Movements of Angola and Mozambique have become more and more necessary and urgent. If you are able to provide any help in this direction, please, don't hesitate to say so.
